Answer: We Are One with God and Heirs to All of His Promises.

II. The Tri-Partite Nature of Human Beings

When God created Adam, He formed Adam as a being composed of three parts.

1 Thess. 5:23 — And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole _____ and _____ and _____ be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gen. 2:7 — And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

- A. "*And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground*" refers to Adam's _____.
- B. "*...and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life*" speaks of God infusing Adam's body with His own _____. Note that this Holy Spirit was the source of Adam's life and the substance of Adam's identity. Adam was created as a _____.
- C. "*and man became a living soul*" tells us that the Spirit of God inside of Adam served as the life-force which ignited Adam's _____, _____ and _____ — the three essential parts of Adam's soul and, together, the foundation of Adam's personality.

III. Adam Sins...and Faces Consequences!

Gen. 2:16-17 — And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; 17 but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for, _____, you shall surely die."

Gen. 3:6 — So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate.

So...did Adam & Eve die “in the day that you eat of it”?

Did their bodies die? Yes No

Did their spirits die? Yes No

Adam and Eve’s spirits “died” in the sense that God withdrew His Spirit from them. As soon as that happened, the _____ which God had given to Adam & Eve reverted to Satan who immediately filled the void inside of Adam and Eve, the empty space left by the absence of God’s Spirit. What Satan placed there in place of the Holy Spirit was “_____” (singular) or what Paul calls “the spirit that works in the children of _____.” (Eph. 2:2)

IV. Adam’s Sin Was the Root of Our Bondage!

As tragic as that is, the real horror was that, just as children born into slavery are born slaves, so Adam’s fallen identity was passed on to all of his children.

Gen. 5:1-3 — *“In the day that God created man, He made him in the _____ of God. 2 He created them male and female, and blessed them and called them Mankind in the day they were created. 3 And Adam lived 130 years, and begot a son in his own _____, after his _____, and named him Seth.*

Rom. 5:12 — *“Therefore, just as through one man (_____) sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned”*

1 Cor. 15:22 — *“For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.”*

V. The Rest of the Bible Is God Bringing Us to a Place Where We Could Choose Life!

Ezek. 36:26-28 — *“I will give you a new heart and put a new _____ within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. 27 I will put _____ Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them. 28 Then you shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers; you shall be My people, and I will be your God.”*

Joel 2:28-29 — *“It shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out _____ on all flesh. Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your old men shall dream dreams. Your young men shall see visions. 29 And also on My menservants and on My maidservants. I will pour out My Spirit in those days.*

That second breath — the breath of our salvation, the second breath of God’s Spirit — finally happens on Easter morning in the Upper Room.

John 20:19-22 — *“Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were [e]assembled, for*

fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you." 20 When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. 21 So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." 22 And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

When the risen Christ breathed His Spirit into these apostles in that upper room, there were living human beings, alive and empowered, on the face of this planet. These men (and women as well, presumably) were literally "born again."

VI. But What Does This "Being Born Again" Actually Do for Us???

1 Cor. 6:17 — *"But he that is joined unto the Lord is _____."*

Eph. 5:30 — *"For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones."*

John 17:20-23 — *"Neither pray I for these (apostles) alone, but for them also who shall believe on me through their word; 21 That they all may be _____; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they may be _____ in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me. 22 And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one: 23 I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me."*

Acts 26:15 — *15 And I said, 'Who are You, Lord?' And the Lord said, 'I am Jesus whom you are _____'."*

1 John 4:17 — *Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because _____, so are we in this world."*

Eph. 1:11-12 — *In whom also we have obtained an _____, ...12 That we should be to the praise of his glory, who first trusted in Christ.*

Luke 4:31-39 — *Then He (Jesus) went down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and was teaching them on the Sabbaths. 32 And they were astonished at His teaching, for His word was with _____ . 33 Now in the synagogue there was a man who had a spirit of an unclean demon. And the demon cried out with a loud voice, 34 saying, “Let _____ alone! What have we to do with You, Jesus of Nazareth? Did You come to destroy us? I know who You Yare—the Holy One of God!” 35 But Jesus _____ him, saying, “Be quiet, and come out of him!” And when the demon had thrown him in their midst, it came out of him and did not hurt him. 36 Then they were all amazed and spoke among themselves, saying, “What a word this is! For with _____ and _____ He _____ the unclean spirits, and they come out.” 37 And the report about Him went out into every place in the surrounding region.*

Luke 5:7 — *Then the devil, taking Him up on a high mountain, showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. 6 And the devil said to Him, “All this _____ I will give You, and their glory; for this has been delivered to me, and I give it to whomever I wish. 7 Therefore, if You will worship before me, all will be Yours.”*

V. Christ, as the Son of God, Took that Authority Back from Satan, and, after Paying Our Ransom on the Cross, Shares His Authority with Us.

Apostles: (Luke 9:1) — *Then He called His twelve disciples together and gave them _____ and _____ over all demons, and to cure _____.*

70 Disciples: (Luke 10:1,9,17) — *After these things the Lord appointed _____ others also, and sent them two by two before His face into every city and place where He Himself was about to go. ... (Then He said to them,) “Heal the sick there, and say to them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’ ... Then the seventy returned with joy, saying, “Lord, even the demons are subject to us in Your name.”*

All Who Believe:

Mark 16:17-18 — *And these signs will follow those who _____: In My name they will cast out _____; they will speak with new tongues; 18 they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.*

John 20:21-22 — *So Jesus said to them again, “Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.” 22 And when He had said this, He _____ on them, and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit.”*

Rom. 5:17 — *For if by the one man’s (Adam’s) offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will _____ in life through the One, Jesus Christ.*

Matt. 6:3 — *“Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.” Greek word for “Kingdom” is “basileia.” Strong’s Concordance defines “basileia” as “royal power, kingship, dominion, rule — not to be confused with an actual kingdom but rather the right or authority to rule over a kingdom”*

1 Cor. 4:20 — *“For the kingdom of God is not a matter of talk but of _____.”*

Acts 4:29-30 — *“And now, Lord, behold their threatenings: and grant unto*

thy servants, that with all boldness they may speak thy word, 30 By stretching forth thine hand to heal; and that signs and wonders may be done by the name of thy holy child Jesus.

Matt. 28:18 — *And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, _____ is given unto me in heaven and in earth. 19 Go ye _____, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.*

Question: As We Work, What Is Our Protection?

Answer: The Gift of His Righteousness.

I. Introduction:

Define “righteousness.” “a quality or attribute of God combining total and perfect innocence with absolute freedom in the face of every standard of law, morality or ethics.

A. Kenny's Law: Those Who Are Ignorant re: Righteousness Will Never Mature beyond Spiritual Diapers.

Heb. 5:13 — 13 Anyone who lives on milk, being still an _____, is not acquainted with the teaching about _____.

B. Our Enemy the Devil Is Limited to Only Two Weapons!

Rev. 12:9-10 — So the great dragon was cast out, that serpent of old, called the Devil and Satan, who _____ the whole world; he was cast to the earth, and his angels were cast out with him. 10 Then I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, "Now salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of His Christ have come, for the _____ of our brethren, who _____ them before our God day and night, has been cast down.

The only weapons Satan possesses are _____ and _____.

II. The Scripture Presents Two Paths to Righteousness.

A. The Law of Moses — Which NEVER Made Anyone Righteous!

Deut. 6:24-25 — "The Lord commanded us to _____ all these decrees and to fear the Lord our God, so that we might always prosper and be kept alive, as is the case today. 25 And if we are careful to _____ all this law before the Lord our God, as he has commanded us, that will be our _____."

Numbers 15:32-26 — "Now while the sons of Israel were in the wilderness, they found a man _____ on the sabbath day. 33 Those who found him brought him to Moses and Aaron and to all the congregation; 34 and they put him in custody because it had not been declared what should be done to him. 35 Then the _____ said to Moses, "The man shall surely be put to death; all the congregation shall stone him with stones outside the camp." 36 So all the congregation brought him outside the camp and stoned him [c]to death with stones, just as the Lord had commanded Moses.

Romans 3:10-12 — "There is no one righteous, not even one; 11 there is no one who understands; there is no one who seeks God. 12 All have turned away, they have together become worthless; there is no one who does good, not even one.

B. The Faith of Abraham — Which Comes to Us by INHERITANCE, Sets Us ENTIRELY Free from the Law and Brings Us into Right Standing with God.

Gen. 15:1-6 — After this, the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, saying, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield and your very great reward. (_____)" 2 But Abram said, "Sovereign Lord, what can you give me since I remain childless and the one who will inherit my estate is Eliezer of Damascus?" 3

And Abram said, “You have given me no children; so servant in my household will be my heir.” 4 Then the word of the Lord came to him: “This man will not be your heir, but a son who is your own flesh and blood will be your heir.” 5 God took Abram outside and said, “Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them.” Then he said to him, “So shall your offspring[d] be.” 6 Abram _____ the Lord, and God credited it to him as _____..

Romans 4:3-5, 13 — 3 What does Scripture say? “Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.” 4 Now to the one who works, wages are not credited as a gift but as an obligation. 5 However, to the one who does not work but trusts God who justifies the ungodly, their faith is credited as righteousness. ...It was not through the law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise ...but through the righteousness that comes by _____.

Gal. 3:13-14, 26 — Christ hath redeemed us from the _____ of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree: 14 That the blessing of _____ might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. ... 26 For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus.

Romans 8:1 — Therefore, there is now no _____ for those who are in Christ Jesus.

III. Abraham’s Picture of Grace: Do Our Sins as Believers Separate Us from God?

A. Three Promises & One Gift

Gen. 15:1 — After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, saying, “Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield. (_____) and your exceedingly great reward (_____).”

Gen. 15:4 — And, behold, the word of the Lord came unto him, saying, This shall not be thine heir; but he that shall come forth out of thine own bowels shall be thine heir.

Gen. 15:6 — And he (_____) believed in the Lord, and He (_____) accounted it to him for righteousness.

Rom. 5:17 — For if by the one man’s (_____) offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the _____ of righteousness will _____ in life through the One, Jesus Christ.

B. The Timing of Isaac’s Birth

Gen. 17:21 — But my covenant will I establish with Isaac, which Sarah shall bear unto thee at this set time in the next year.

C. The Challenge to Abram's Faith

Gen. 19:27-29 — And Abraham went early in the morning to the place where he had stood before the Lord. 28 Then he looked toward Sodom and Gomorrah, and toward all the land of the plain; and he saw, and behold, the smoke of the land went up like the smoke of a furnace. 29 And it came to pass, when God destroyed the cities of the plain, that God remembered Abraham, and sent Lot out of the midst of the overthrow, when He overthrew the cities in which Lot had dwelt.

D. Abram Falls into Serious Sin

Gen. 20:1-2 — And Abraham journeyed from there to the South, and dwelt between Kadesh and Shur, and stayed in Gerar. 2 Now Abraham said of Sarah his wife, "She is my sister." And Abimelech king of Gerar sent and took Sarah.

What was Abraham's sin? (Hint: It wasn't just about lying.) _____

E. God Keeps His Promise of Protection, in Spite of Abraham's Sin!

Gen. 20:3-7 — But God came to Abimelech in a dream by night, and said to him, "Indeed you are a dead man because of the woman whom you have taken, for she is a man's wife." 4 But Abimelech had not come near her; and he said, "Lord, will You slay a righteous nation also? 5 Did he not say to me, 'She is my sister'? And she, even she herself said, 'He is my brother.' In the integrity of my heart and innocence of my hands I have done this." 6 And God said to him in a dream, "Yes, I know that you did this in the integrity of your heart. For I also withheld you from sinning against Me; therefore I did not let you touch her. 7 Now therefore, restore the man's wife; for he is a _____, and he will _____ for you and you shall live. But if you do not restore her, know that you shall surely die, you and all who are yours."

F. God Keeps His Promise of Provision, in Spite of Abraham's Sin!

Gen. 20:14-16 — Then Abimelech took sheep, oxen, and male and female servants, and gave them to Abraham; and he restored Sarah his wife to him. 15 And Abimelech said, "See, my land is before you; dwell where it pleases you." 16 Then to Sarah he said, "Behold, I have given your brother a thousand pieces of silver; indeed this vindicates you before all who are with you and before everybody." Thus she was rebuked.

G. God Keeps His Promise of a Son, in Spite of Abraham's Sin!

Gen. 21:1-2 — And the Lord visited Sarah as He had said, and the Lord did for Sarah as He had spoken. 2 For Sarah conceived and bore Abraham a son in his old age, at the set time of which God had spoken to him.

IV. This Kind of Righteousness then Comes to Us, Not by Our Behavior, but by Inheritance.

- A. **Romans 4:13** — *For the promise, that he should be the heir of the world, was not to Abraham or his seed through the _____, but through the righteousness of _____.*
- B. **Gal. 3:26, 29** — *For you are all sons of God _____ in Christ Jesus. 29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.*
- C. **Heb. 11:7** — *By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became _____ of the righteousness which is by faith.*

IV. Declaration

The Scripture teaches that God has forgiven the sins of the world.
Because of the blood of Jesus, God is no longer counting any sin against me.

I am no longer a sinner; I possess the same righteousness as Christ does.
Because I have received God's righteousness, I am totally worthy of every blessing.
God will bring His Kingdom to Earth through me.

Session 4: Seven Steps

Question: How Do We Minister Healing (and Deliverance)?

I. Seven Steps to Healing

- 1. Use both ears..**
- 2. Ask good questions.**
- 3. Ask permission.**
- 4. Rebuke darkness.**
- 5. Let Christ in us command healing.**
- 6. Check results. (Repeat as necessary.)**
- 7. Celebrate the healing.**

II. Twelve Steps to Successful Deliverance

- 1. Know your authority & your righteousness.**
- 2. Act only if you are confident of long-term success. (Matt. 12:43-45)**
- 3. Do not act alone.**
- 4. Know your surroundings.**
- 5. Sit very close but avoid touching.**
- 6. Address issues of faith, shame or unforgiveness.**
- 7. Instruct him or her to look eyes with you.**
- 8. Explain briefly what you are doing and his/her role (to receive & communicate)..**
- 9. By the authority of Christ in you, cancel demonic assignments and command as the Holy Spirit guides you.**
- 10. Watch carefully. Persist and do not be intimidated.**
- 11. Bless the subject and honor them with confidence.**
- 12. Follow up with the subject and invest whatever time is necessary.**
